Turn left at water tower onto Orchard Street and go 1.2 miles to King Street on your right. Turn right onto King Street and go 1.6 miles to 935 King-a green cape on the right.

FROM RT. 495: Take Rt. 44 west, which is the Taunton/Providence exit. Go west 2 miles to Church Street at the Honda dealership on the right.

Take a right onto Church Street and immediately bear left the fork in the road; Go .4 miles on Church Street and cross Judson Street onto Locust Street; go 1.2 miles on Locust Street and take a left onto King Street; 935 King is the third house on the left.
